1. Aronga | Purpose

The main purpose of the Scholarship is to assist a graduate of the University of Canterbury to study Art History, English Literature, Music, or Fine Arts overseas in an environment that encourages the completion of a course or work in progress, or the undertaking of further training in a recognised institution.

2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

2.1 Applicants must have completed, or will complete in the year of application, an undergraduate or postgraduate degree or diploma in either Art History, English Literature, Fine Arts, or Music at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury and be intending to undertake a master's degree or doctoral programme at an overseas institution in the following year in one of the following subjects:

- a. Art History
- b. English literature
- c. Fine Arts
- d. Music

2.2 Applicants must be citizens of Aotearoa New Zealand or holders of Aotearoa New Zealand residence class visas.

3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

3.1 Applications must be made by 31 October, online at the Scholarships website of Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury.²

3.2 Scholarships will be offered every two years (in odd-number years).

4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

- 4.1 Normally, one scholarship is available every two years.
- 4.2 The scholarship is awarded by the Council of Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury on the recommendation of the Selection Committee comprising:
 - a. the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor of Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury (or nominee);
 - b. the Tumuaki Tari, Toi o Nehe, Toi Ariā | Head of the Department of Art History and Theory;
 - c. the Tumuaki Tari | Head of the Department of English;
 - d. the Tumuaki Kura, Te Kura Kōwaiwai | Head of the School of Fine Arts; and
 - e. the Tumuaki Kura, Te Kura Puoro | Head of the School of Music.
- 4.3 The selection committee may choose to interview an applicant.

5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

- 5.1 In making their recommendation, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:
 - a. demonstrated artistic ability;³
 - b. proposed course of study, research, or creative work;
 - c. academic achievement, based on the applicant's grade point average in their prior study;
 - d. standing of the institution at which the proposed study, research, or creative work will be undertaken;
 - e. potential to contribute to society in the chosen field; and
 - f. financial need.⁴
- 5.2 If, in any offering, there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no scholarship is offered.

6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

- 6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance up to a value of \$30,000 per annum.¹
- 6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to a recipient's nominated Aotearoa New Zealand bank account, as soon as practicable after confirmation of enrolment as specified in clause 7.2.

7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

- 7.1 The Scholarship must be taken up in the year following the year of application.
- 7.2 The scholarship is tenable at a recognised overseas institution during full-time or part-time enrolment in a programme of study, research, or creative work towards a master's or doctoral degree in one of the following subjects:
 - a. Art History
 - b. English literature
 - c. Fine Arts
 - d. Music
- 7.3 The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- 7.4 With the permission of the Amo Rangahau | Dean of Postgraduate Research (or nominee) at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury, a recipient may co-tenure the scholarship with another award, if that award's conditions permit co-tenure.
- 7.5 The scholarship may be withdrawn, and any paid funds may be recovered if, during tenure, the recipient does not:
 - a. maintain an enrolment that meets the conditions specified in clause 7.2;
 - b. maintain satisfactory academic engagement;⁵
 - c. spend the scholarship only on meeting the costs of undertaking the programme of study, research, or creative work as specified in clause 7.2; and

- d. adhere to the statutes, regulations, policies, and rules of the institution at which the scholarship is held.

8. Whakamahuki | Background information

The scholarship commemorates Anne Reid of Waiharakeke Blenheim, Ōtautahi Christchurch, Singapore, and Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland, who studied and taught at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha University of Canterbury and the National University of Singapore. The Anne Reid Memorial Trust established the scholarship in 2002.
