

BICKERTON-WIDDOWSON TRUST MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Bickerton-Widdowson Trust Memorial Scholarships, administered by the Trustees, were established by a bequest in 1957 under the will of the late Clara Bickerton for the purpose of assisting students in the continuance of studies at the University of Canterbury. Income from the Trust is made available annually to the Christchurch Boys' High School, the Christchurch Girls' High School, Hagley Community College and the School of Fine Arts of the University of Canterbury.

Regulations governing the scholarships tenable at the School of Fine Arts of the University of Canterbury are as follows:

1. Scholarships tenable at the School of Fine Arts of the University of Canterbury are open to any student of the School of Fine Arts.
2. Bickerton-Widdowson Trust Memorial Scholarships shall be awarded annually by the Trustees after receiving a recommendation from the Management Committee, School of Fine Arts.
3. Each scholarship shall be tenable for one year and shall be awarded on the basis of academic merit.
4. Each scholarship shall be paid, in full, at the time of enrolment.
5. The tenure of each scholarship may be terminated at any time by the Trustees, if they receive an unfavourable report on the conduct or progress of a scholar, and the student may then be required to repay a portion of the scholarship.
6. Applications shall be made to the Scholarships Office no later than 5.00 p.m. on 1 November.

NOTE: Several scholarships are normally available for award each year. The emolument of each scholarship will be decided individually and the maximum emolument for any award is currently \$2000.
