

# Ethel Susan Jones Fine Arts Travelling Scholarship

## Waeture | Regulations

### Whakamāramatanga | Key Information

<b>Rā whakamutunga Closing date</b>	1 November
<b>Whaipanga   Value</b>	\$5,000
<b>Wā roanga   Tenure</b>	The tenure of the scholarship shall not normally exceed two years
<b>Rahinga ia tau   Number available annually</b>	At least 4
<b>Herenga tika   Applicable enrolment during tenure</b>	Overseas travel to further study in Fine Arts
<b>Herenga motuhake Special requirement</b>	Must have satisfactorily completed at least one term's study at the University of Canterbury School of Fine Arts in a studio course, although the award will normally be made to students who are close to completion of, or have completed within the last two years, a BFA, BFA(Hons) or MFA Degree

### 1. Aronga | Purpose

The purpose of the Ethel Susan Jones Travelling Scholarship shall be to assist students or former students of the University of Canterbury School of Fine Arts to further their study in Fine Arts by visiting other countries.

### 2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

- 2.1 The scholarship shall be open to anyone who has satisfactorily completed at least one term's study at the University of Canterbury School of Fine Arts in a studio course, although the award will normally be made to students who are close to completion of, or who have completed within the last two years, a BFA, BFA(Hons) or MFA Degree.
- 2.2 Applicants shall be students at the School of Fine Arts who have achieved excellence in studio courses, especially in original composition.<sup>1</sup>

### 3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

- 3.1 Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website<sup>2</sup> by 1 November.
- 3.2 Applicants shall submit a detailed study proposal, including the purpose of the work to be undertaken.
- 3.3 Applicants shall also state how the study proposal relates to previous studio achievements and how it is likely to benefit the applicant in the future.

## 4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

- 4.1 At least 4 scholarships are normally available annually.
- 4.2 The scholarship is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:
  - a. the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor (or nominee); and
  - b. The Head of the School of Fine Arts (or nominee).

## 5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

- 5.1 In making the recommendations, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:
  - a. achievements of applicants in original composition<sup>1</sup>; and
  - b. the purpose and suitability of the overseas travel proposal.
- 5.2 If, in any year, there are fewer candidates of sufficient merit than there are awards available, fewer awards are made.

## 6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

- 6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance at a value of \$5,000.
- 6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to the recipient's nominated Aotearoa New Zealand bank account.
- 6.3 The initial instalment of \$4,000 will be paid to the recipient's bank account after the submission of PDF's/screenshots of proposed travel and accommodation expenses and a firm itinerary, in accordance with the detailed travel proposal submitted with their application. After the travel, the final instalment will be released on production of a satisfactory report from the candidate to the Head of Fine Arts on the progress of the agreed programme.

## 7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

- 7.1 The scholarship must be taken up in the year following the year of application.
- 7.2 The scholarship is tenable for overseas travel to further study in Fine Arts. It is not tenable within New Zealand.
- 7.3 The scholarship is tenable for up to two years.
- 7.4 The scholarship is co-tenable with any other award unless the conditions of the other award preclude this.
- 7.5 The scholar shall submit a fully documented report to the Head of the School of Fine Arts once the travel is complete.
- 7.6 The scholarship may be withdrawn, and any paid funds may be recovered if, during tenure, the recipient does not maintain satisfactory progress and conduct, or if the recipient fails to submit a final report to the Head of the School of Fine Arts before the end of the tenure of the award.

## 8. Whakamahuki | Background information

Miss Ethel Susan Jones, sometime student of the Canterbury University College School of Art, gave the College a sum of money to establish: "a travelling scholarship for students of the Art School."
