1. Aronga | Purpose

The scholarship supports Arts graduates of Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury to undertake further study at an overseas institution.

2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

2.1 Applicants must have been either:

- a. born in Aotearoa New Zealand; or
- b. resident in Aotearoa New Zealand for a total of at least seven years on the closing date for applications.

2.2 Successful applicants must have graduated from Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury with a master's degree from Te Rāngai Toi Tangata | College of Arts or with a MusB(Hons) by the time they take up the scholarship.

2.3 Applicants must not currently hold, or have previously held, the Tytheridge Travelling Scholarship in Arts.

3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website² by 1 November.

4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

4.1 Normally, there may be only one holder of the scholarship at a time.¹ The scholarship is advertised as it becomes available.

4.2 The scholarship is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:

- a. the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor (or nominee);
- b. the Amo Matua, Te Rāngai Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts (or nominee); and
- c. another Amo, Te Rāngai Toi Tangata | Dean of Arts (or nominee).

5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

5.1 In making the recommendations, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:

- a. academic achievement;
- b. intended overseas institution and programme of study;
- c. character; and
- d. potential for leadership, and prospects for contributing to society.

Short-listed candidates may be required to attend an interview with the selection committee.

5.2 If, in any year that the scholarship is available, there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no scholarship is offered in that year.

6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance at a value of \$55,000 per annum.

6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to the recipient's nominated New Zealand bank account.

6.3 Payments commence as soon as practicable after confirmation of enrolment as specified in clause 7.3.

7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

7.1 During tenure of the scholarship the holder is known as a Tytheridge Scholar.

7.2 The scholarship must be taken up in the year following the year of application.

7.3 The scholarship is tenable during a programme of full-time postgraduate study at an overseas institution, as specified in the recipient's application (or, with the permission of the Amo Rangahau Dean of Postgraduate Research, in an appropriate alternative programme).

7.4 The scholarship is tenable for the minimum period that would normally be required to complete the specified programme of study, but for no more than three years.

7.5 Except with the permission of the Amo Rangahau | Dean of Postgraduate Research, the scholarship is not co-tenable with any other award.³

7.6 If, during tenure, a recipient's enrolment no longer meets the conditions specified in clause 7.3, the scholarship may be withdrawn and any paid funds may be recovered.

7.7 Continuation of a scholarship is conditional on:

- a. satisfactory academic progress, as evidenced by annual reports on progress that have been endorsed by the head of the department in which the recipient is studying;⁴ and
- b. satisfactory personal conduct.

8. Whakamahuki | Background information

The funds for this scholarship are provided by the income from a bequest made in 1960 from the estate of Alan Courtney Tytheridge (d. 1959). Mr Tytheridge was a student of Canterbury College, who graduated in 1912 with an MA with first class honours. He lived in Japan for several decades, and at the time of his death he was a lecturer in English at Tsuda University in Tokyo.
