1. Aronga | Purpose

The UC Department of Civil and Natural Resources Short-Term Research Scholarship supports students undertaking short-term research projects and other experiments to provide a foundation for their studies or future studies with the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury.

2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

2.1 Recipients must be undertaking or intending to undertake a programme of study in conjunction with the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury within 12 months of completion of tenure of the scholarship.

3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

3.1 Applications must be made through the Scholarships website by 30 November.¹

4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

4.1 Scholarships will be made available as projects and funds become available.

4.2 The scholarship is awarded by the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:

- the Head of the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering (or nominee); and
- the Postgraduate Director of the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering (or nominee).

5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

5.1 In making the recommendations, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:

- a. academic achievement;
- b. likelihood of success in the applicant's research and subsequent studies; and
- c. strategic objectives of the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering

5.2 If, in any year, there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no scholarships are offered.

6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance at a value determined by funds available and stated in the offer of the award.

6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to the recipient's nominated New Zealand bank account according to the details laid out in the offer of award.

7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

7.1 The scholarship must be taken up within three months of the date of the offer of the award.

7.2 The scholarship is tenable by students undertaking short-term research projects and other experiments to provide a foundation for their studies with the Department of Civil and Natural Resources Engineering at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury with the aim of allowing them to develop skills to further their academic journey.

7.3 The scholarship is tenable for the duration stated in the offer of award.

7.4 The scholarship is co-tenable with any other award unless the conditions of the other award preclude this.

7.5 The scholarship may be withdrawn, and any paid funds may be recovered if, during tenure, the recipient does not:

- a. maintain satisfactory engagement in the research project; and
- b. adhere to the University's statutes, regulations, policies, and rules.
