1. Aronga | Purpose

This scholarship recognises and supports high-achieving students at Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury who are entering their first year of a programme for a BA, BDataSci, or BSc degree and majoring in Data Science, Financial Engineering, Mathematics, or Statistics.

2. Paearu māraurau | Eligibility criteria

Applicants must not have been enrolled in a degree programme at any tertiary institute.² International students who meet this requirement are eligible to apply.

3. Tukanga tononga | Application process

Applications must be made online at the Scholarships website³ by 15 August.

4. Tukanga kōwhiringa | Selection process

- 4.1 Six scholarships are available annually, one of which is reserved for a student with whakapapa Māori, and one of which is reserved for a Pacific/Pasifika student.1
- 4.2 The scholarship is awarded by Te Kaunihera | University Council on the recommendation of a selection committee comprising:

- a. the Tumu Whakarae | Vice-Chancellor (or nominee);
- b. the Amo Matua | Executive Dean of Engineering (or nominee);
- c. the Tumuaki Kura, Te Kura Pāngarau | Head of the School of Mathematics and Statistics (or nominee); and
- d. the Kaihautū Matua, Te Waka Pākākano | Executive Director of the Office of Māori, Pacific, and Equity (or nominee).

5. Paearu kōwhiringa | Selection criteria

- 5.1 In making the recommendation, the selection committee gives equal consideration to:
 - a. demonstrated commitment to, or interest in, the intended degree programme;
 - b. academic achievement at NCEA Level 2 or in equivalent university entrance qualifications; and
 - c. strategic objectives of the University.
- 5.2 If, in any year, there is no applicant with whakapapa Māori or no applicant who is Pacific/Pasifika who is of sufficient merit, the scholarship reserved for such students is made available to other applicants.
- 5.3 If, in any year, there are fewer candidates of sufficient merit than there are scholarships available, fewer scholarships are offered.

6. Mahere utu | Value and payment schedule

- 6.1 The scholarship provides financial assistance at a value of \$2,000.
- 6.2 The scholarship is paid by direct credit to a recipient's nominated Aotearoa New Zealand bank account as soon as practicable after:
 - a. the final date, in the first semester of enrolment, on which a student may receive a full refund for withdrawal from a course;⁴ and
 - b. confirmation of enrolment as specified in clause 7.2.

7. Paearu here | Tenability and retention criteria

- 7.1 The scholarship must be taken up in the year following the year of application.
- 7.2 The scholarship is tenable during full-time enrolment at the University in a programme for a BA, BSc, or BDataSci degree with:
 - a. a major in Data Science and an enrolment in
 - i. MATH 102, and
 - ii. STAT101 or DATA 101:

or

- b. a major in Financial Engineering and an enrolment in MATH 103 and STAT 101; or
- c. a major in Mathematics and an enrolment in MATH 103; or
- d. a major in Statistics and an enrolment in STAT 101.

Recipients who have completed MATH 199 are exempt from enrolling in MATH 102 or MATH 103.

- 7.3 The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- 7.4 The scholarship is co-tenable with the following:
 - a. Any award that is not funded by the University, unless the conditions of the other award preclude this
 - b. Tuition fee scholarships
 - c. Go Waitaha Canterbury Scholarship
 - d. UC Hiranga Scholarship
 - e. UC Takere Scholarship

- Apart from the scholarships listed above, the scholarship is not co-tenable with any other award funded by the University.
- 7.5 If, during tenure, a recipient's enrolment no longer meets the conditions specified in clause 7.2, the scholarship may be withdrawn and any paid funds may be recovered.
- 7.6 Continuation of a scholarship is conditional on satisfactory academic engagement⁵ and adherence to the University's statutes, regulations, policies, and rules.

8. Whakamahuki | Background information

The then Department of Mathematics and Statistics established the scholarship in 2012.
